BUYING ON-LINE

When shopping on-line, shop for well-known companies whenever possible. Already, the Better Business Bureau is reporting dozens of fake business websites advertising cheap goods.

Rule of thumb: If the company is

not nationally or locally known, RESEARCH!

Don't hand over your hard-earned money to the

GRINCH.

BUYING IN PERSON

- Remember to ask for a receipt, especially when using a debit or credit card.
- Use a trackable payment, such as PayPal or a credit card.
- Don't leave your purse or wallet unattended on a counter or floor.



HOW TO TELL IF IT'S A SCAM

- Is the deal "too good to be true?" If so, you may want to rethink this purchase.
- Does the webpage include https:// and a padlock in the URL? If not, this site isn't protecting your information.
- Is the only payment method Western Union or Money Grams? If so, STAY AWAY!
